Bruce passed away after a lengthy battle with Alzheimer's.

Bruce will be lovingly remembered by his wife Luci of 53 years, a son, daughter and one grand daughter. Bruce is also survived by two brothers and sister Donna Thomas (Franklin) who is also a **POWER Team** member.

Bruce's father-in-law, Murray Downey (and mother-in-law, Edna Downey) was a long-time professor at Canadian Bible College in the area of evangelism.

Bruce grew up in Hamilton, Ontario and met his wife Luci Downey at Canadian Bible College in Regina, Sask. in 1969. They were married in 1972. Bruce pastored Alliance churches in Windsor Ontario, Sherwood Park & Calgary Alberta, and Surrey BC.

In 2001 he became a chaplain with the Vancouver Fire Department but volunteered in other departments in the Lower Mainland. He was involved in the development of the CFFF (Canadian Fallen Firefighters Foundation) and played the Last Post regularly at their annual gatherings in Ottawa which was livestreamed across the country.



Bruce made lifelong friends in the fire departments as well as in each of the churches he served in. He touched everyone who knew him. He was known also for his trumpet playing and musicianship in leading large productions, singing and playing in bands.

There he worked doing discipleship and equipping as well as working with the youth.

After 5 years at Sheridan, he accepted the Pastor position for Brampton West Alliance Church in Brampton Ontario. After 20 years at Brampton West Alliance Church, Dan completed his work there. In 2014, Dan was led to the ministry of Family Life Canada, Power2Change. He worked with Joy to reach out and offer help & hope to marriages and families. It wasn't long before he was asked to take on the role of Director of

Development, Indigenous Ministries and was tirelessly connecting and working with Indigenous peoples (now friends) across Canada.

Aug 1- 2025, Dan was diagnosed with aggressive Metastasized Melanoma throughout his body. God called him home October 7, 2025. One of his concerns was for the students. Serving God, being faithful in ministry & life was always his top priority. Because this is so important to Dan & Joy, the courses will carry on so others can be discipled and equipped.

Some info from the book A grace Disguised

There are a number of our **POWER Team** who have lost a spouse in 2025. One is a former Elder of Glencairn Alliance Church in Regina that I was pastoring. Lorne Fredlund (a **POWER Team** member) began his journey when his wife Peggy was called home to be with the Lord Valentine's Day.

Before my wife Betty was called home July 30th on our 59th Engagement Anniversary, Lorne phoned Betty and spoke into her life which was very significant for her. Since Betty's death, Lorne connected with me and shared significant insights as well as welcomed support for my new journey. He introduced me to the book, **A Grace Disguised, how the soul grows through loss**, by Jerry Sittser

I am taking the liberty to pass on to you some things I underlined that struck me. These sentences will not give you the context in which they were written but I am sure will be helpful for those of us who have suffered loss as well as all of us in our journey of life.

---- parts of the first two chapters-----

"Loss leaves the landscape of one's life forever changed".

"That torrent of emotion swept away the life I had held dear for so many years. The woman/man to whom I've been married for over two decades was dead".

"The steady seepage of pain that comes when grief, like floodwaters refusing to subside, finds every crack and crevice of the human spirit to enter and erode".

"I had no way of anticipating the adjustments I would have to make and the suffering I would have to endure in the months and years ahead".

"I knew that I was suspended somehow between two worlds. One was the world of my past, so wonderful to me, which was now gone. The other was the world of my future, which awaited me. The loss brought about by the end of her/his life, changed mine, setting me on a course down which I had to journey, whether I wanted to or not. One phase of my life had ended; another, the most difficult was about to begin".

"The results are permanent the impact incalculable, the consequences cumulative. Each new day forces one to face some new and devastating dimension of the loss. It creates a whole new context for one's life".

"My wife's/husband's absence touches almost every area of my life. At times, I feel almost desperate to find just one part of my life that was not affected by her/his presence and does not therefore suffer from her absence".

"No one will ever know the pain I've experienced because it is my own. The big question is, 'what meaning can be gained from suffering, and how can we grow through suffering?" (to be continued in Next **CONNECTOR** –Wayne Kerr)


Maybe this will help us to pray for those who are on this journey, one we all will face.
